Mr. Blixt stated that mastitis accounts for more dairy losses in than perhaps diseases It is a disease, he said, that all dairymen have experienced sometime during their lifetime. The reason it is so costly and hard to control is due to the fact that there are many types of mastitis organisms that cause the disease and there are also many known management failures that seem to bring on the outbreak of mastitis. For that reason, the agent said, the above

The Agent stated that at the first meeting at the Winchip Farm at Fillmore, Dr. John Marvin will be in charge. Dr. Marvin will demonstrate various degrees of infection and he will show how the disease can be detected in its various stages and what might be done to control it from a medicinal treatment standpoint. At the second meeting on February 21st, at the Robert Stowell farm, the district agricultural engineer, Robert Rooney, and Prof. J. A. White of the Dairy Industry Dept. at Cornell University, will discuss and demonstrate the proper dairy housing and care of dairy utensils as two of the important ways of controling mas-titis. Mr. Blixt said that these two meetings will give Allegany County dairymen an opportunity to get more information regarding this dread disease in dairy animals and also have some o' their questions answered. All dairymen are invited to attend these meetings.




