By Billie Ryan How many lunch boxes do you pack. Does the person carrying them ever tire of the same things? Try these new suggestions as a way to help bring the lunch back to flavor. Plan the lunch to be carried at the same time that you plan the evening meal. Food saved from the evening meal for the lunch box should be varied in form to avoid repeti-

tion. Meat for sandwiches may be ground or chopped, seasoned eggs or cheese and salad dressing. A dash of onion salt or make it different from another one, which has been seasoned with pickle, catsup or mustard. may be varied by the addition of Instead of the salad which was served at dinner, the lunch box may contain a wedge of cabbage, crisp lettuce leaves or fresh fruit. l'ittle surprise in a child's box is a very welcome diversion from a day at school.
