

It is announced by H. Ira Blixt that the Annual Hay Day sponsored by the Farm Bureau Dairy County Farm Equipment Dealer's Association, is tentatively set for Wednesday, June 18, at 10 a.m., at the Lynn Corbin & Son farm, on Corbin Hill, just outside of

The agent said that 25 acres on this farm will be harvested that day, weather permitting, part of it being put into a silo as grass silage and also part of it will go in on a hay drier, both methods being used on the Corbin farm.

The agent said that this is the was renovated three years ago by the Allegany County Farm Equipment Dealers' Asso. At that time, he said, this 25 acre field was very poor pasture. partly covered with brush. measurers and new seeding mixtures, along with good management and proper fertilization, Mr. Corbin will probably take off in the neighborhood of 2-3 ton of hay to the acre this year.

The primary purpose of this Hay Day, Mr. Blixt said, is to demonstrate various hay harvesting methods to put up quality hay and also to give farmers an opportunity to see various types of machinery in action, and in comparison with each other. Last year, the agent stated that approximately 1500 people attended. and he stated that he expects the number to exceed that amount this year, in that there is an unusually high interest in the production of quality hay on Allegany County farms.


