

### Agricultural News

IRA BLIXT, County Agent

H. Ira Blixt, County Agricultural Agent, announces that the Christmas Treepruning and thinning demonstration and meeting will be held at the Clayton Mc-Queen forestry plantation on Noble Street, Belmont, N. Y., this Friday evening, June 6, at 7:30 p. m. Prof L. S. Hamilton, Extension Forester from Cornell University will be on hand to discuss and demonstrate the proper technique of thinning and pruning various species of Christmas trees. After the meeting, Mr. Mc-Queen will demonstrate how his famous baseball bats are made. This should be very interesting to everyone who is interested in

woodworking. Everyone is in-

vited to this meeting.

Haying operations mark the beginning of a season when farm accidents run high, cautions County Agent H. Ira Blixt. To assure safety and avoid lost time, check equipment carefully before having starts. Agent Blixt recomends that special precautions be taken to prevent falls from hay racks and hay mows. He urges farmers to be sure that barn floors are in good repair and hay chutes guarded to avoid falls. Special care should be taken in making starts and stops while loading, especially on rough ground. Never jump from tractors or mowers while they are in operation, for the few minutes saved in attempting to do this might result several weeks in a hospital.

Check all equipment carefully for defective hitches, ropes, pulleys, lifts, hay racks and loaders. Also make sure that all safety guards are in place on the mowing equipment. For outside work, carry a pitchfork over the shoulder and stick it securely in the ground when not in use. Don't lay it down; and never throw a pitchfork. At the end of a day's work, see that it is hung up or stored in a rack in the barn.

out that damp hay is one of the principal of barn fires, so Allegany County farmers should make sure that their hay is well cured before it is stored in hay mows, or if used on hay finishers, that hay not be placed on these with high degree of moisture. Freshly stored hay should be checked to see that there is no sign of heating. This can be done with the use of a hay probe. For further information on the use of this, contact the Farm Bureau Office


