2-Day Deer Season In Letchworth State Park

The Genesee State Park Commission has announced that hunting for deer only by hunters having proper State Licenses will be permitted on Friday and Saturday, November 28 and 29 in Letchworth State Park, except in that portion of the park west of the Genesee River in Wyoming County south of the "Denton Corners Road."

In making this announcement, the Commission cautioned hunters that hunting or possession of a gun in any part of the park except on these two days is a misdemean er punishable by either or both fine not exceeding \$100.00, and imprisonment not exceeding thirty days. The same penalties apply to hunting or possession of a gun in the reserved area of the park on November 28 and 29. These

penalties will be rigidly enforced. No hunting or possession of a gun will be permitted within Hani-Beach State Park or within the Lake Ontario State Parkway right-

The First Square

Three square meals. We take t for granted that every growing boy and girl should have three square meals a day. Communities pride themselves on their hot lunch programs, on the well-balanced meals available in school cafeterias. Mothers strain the budget to fill the bottomless pits around the dinner table with a balanced diet. But the "First

square" is too often neglectd. The high school girl spends the precious morning minutes trying out a new hairdo, grabs a piece of toast, and rushes out the door. The teen-age boy who has ignored alarms, calls and vigorous shakes sleeps till the last moment, downs a glass of milk and runs to catch the bus.

Nothing very square about those breakfasts. And even worse, a recent survey showed that 15 per cent of all high school girls and nine per cent of the boys eat no breakfast at all before starting It's not surprising that these younsters who have been fasting since dinner-16 or 17 hours back—suffer from 11 A. M. fatigue. The class hours until lunchtime are wasted because they can't pay attention. They are

restless and bored, and tired. High school boys and girls often seem quite grown up, but they are not yet completed products. They are constantly, steadily growing. Their days are busy, crammed with learning and playing. They burn up fuel like two legged steam engines. The average diet of an adult cannot meet their demands. That first square should be even more nutritious than one necessary to get the housewife through till lunch.
