Adapted from the historic Cross of Lorraine, is the registered insigna of the Na tonal Tuberculosis Association and the 3,000 affiliated state and local associations in the annual Christmas Seal Sale to support their year-around programs of the control and prevention of tubecule sis. This year's sale began on Novvember 17 and continues until December 25.


