Addition To Jones Memorial Hospital Put Before Commission

Governor Rockefeller put before the Appalachian Regional Commission this week an application for construction of an addition to the Jones Memorial Hospital in Wellsville, Allegany County, estimated to cost \$1,600,000.

This medical facility is part of the State's master plan prepared for the Federal Hill-Burton Aid Program under which it is anticipated, one-third of the cost of the new addition, or \$504,960, would be paid by the Federal Government, with the balance to be provided from current allocations to New York State under Section 214 of the federal Appalachian Regional Development Act of 1965, the balance to come from endowments and local fundraising campaigns.

The Governor, in his letter submitting the proposed project, said the hospital "serves Allegany and Steuben counties in New York State, and much of Potter County in Pennsylvania". The addition, if approved, he added, "will provide the only facility for long term hospital care in this section of New York's 'Appalachia' region."

While the Village of Wellsville has approximately 6,000 population, the Jones Memorial Hospital serves an area population of about 29,000. The new addition would improve medical facilities for the area when completed, while its construction would contribute substantially to employment opportunities. The addition, if approved, is expected to be in operation within two years.

Proof Of Ownership On All New And Used Motor Boats Registration

An immediate tightening of registration requirements for proof of ownership on all new and used motor boats has been announced by the State Conservation Department.

According to James J. O'Brien, Director of the Division of Motor Boats, no boat registration application will be accepted unless it is accompanied by the properly signed registration certificate of the former owner, or, in case of new vessels, a bill of sale. The prepaid dealer form, provided to marine dealers by the Division, will be accepted in lieu of a bill of sale for new vessels never before registered. The use of prepaid dealer forms for used vessels will not be accepted.

If this procedure is not followed, Mr. O'Brien said, the registration application will be returned to the owner, resulting in considerable delay in the issuance of a registration certificate.

Although the new procedure will affect the registration of all new vessels and the re-registration of sold used boats, it will not change the registration renewal process, he added.

"Our experience over the years indicates an increase in boating thefts, fraudulent registrations and dishonest sales of registered vessels," O'Brien said.

The new procedure is being put into effect to provide greater protection to the boatmen, the buyer and the dealer.
