**Greenwood Central School News**

Two members of the ninth grade at Greenwood Central School have earned Certificates of Educational Development for having scored in the top ten percent nationally on the National Educational Development Tests.

Terry Hunt, son of Mr. and Mrs. John Hunt, Greenwood, and John Mullikan, son of Mr. and Mrs. John Mullikan, Rexville, will receive their certificates at the school's annual awards assembly to be held later in the school year.

The National Educational Development Tests measure a student's abilities to apply what has been learned in the following areas: English Usage, Math Usage, Social Studies Reading, Natural Science Reading, and word Usage.

This battery of test is administered annually in the Greenwood Central School to all entering freshmen.

This Thursday night, January 6, an adult education class in basic art will be started at the Greenwood Central School. In making this announcement Supervising Principal Robert Hoag-

land noted that this would be the first time adult education had been offered in the community in several years, whether the course would be able to operate would depend on the interest of the citizens of the community.

It is hoped that at least ten prospective artists will register for the course which will be taught by Mr. Robert Henshaw, who is employed cooperatively by the Canisteo and Greenwood School system.

At the first meeting, it is expected that registration and orientation will take place from 8:00 - 9:00 with a time for sketching and drawing immediately afterwards. There will not be any charge for the course although supplies and oil painting materials will need to be purchased by the students later in the course.

At the organizational meeting the time and hours for future meetings will be discussed by members of the class. Anyone interested in basic instruction in art is invited to register, or if you have questions please contact the school authorities.
