The basic school year salary is \$4,835. In addition, employees receive free government quarters, if available, or a housing allowance for local economy housing. An additional post differential from 10 to 25 is paid in some areas. Transportation costs plus expenses enroute are paid by the United States government.

Schools are located in the following areas: Iceland, Labrador, Newfoundland, Bermuda, Guantánamo Bay, Cuba, Trinidad, Korea, Azores, Japan, Okinawa, Philippine Islands, Taiwan, Midway, England, Scotland, France, Germany, Italy, Sicily, Spain, the Netherlands, Norway, Denmark, Crete, Libya, Turkey, Asmara, Ethiopia, Morocco, Pakistan.
