



**SOCIAL NOTES**

Mr. and Mrs. Lewis Ackerman of 38 1/2 Pleasant St., Wellsville, observed their golden wedding anniversary January 4th. They were honored at a dinner and reception at the home of her brother, Mr. and Mrs. Ernest Dixon at Bath. Mr. Ackerman, a brother of Mrs. Glenn Skuse, formerly of Andover and his wife, were frequent visitors in Andover.

Two brothers, Wallace and Norman Francisco, of Belmont, R. D. accepted the Century Farm Award at the 134th annual meeting of the State Agricultural Society in Albany, honored by Governor Nelson A. Rockefeller, Wednesday. It started back in 1862 when John Woodley Windus, who emigrated to here from England, settled on 87 acres, which are still part of the farm. These two brothers who are carrying on the family tradition as farmers at a homestead hacked out of the woods near here 103 years ago with Wallace's son, Frederick, operated a 400-acre dairy farm on River Rd., Belmont. They grow most of their own feed for their herd of 100 purebred Holsteins, 70 of them milking cows and the rest young stock. The farm is known as Francisco Farms Inc.

The Robert Webber family home on Centerville - Fairview Road was burned to the foundation in the three and one half hour blaze Sunday night. Centerville Fire Chief John Ellwood said Monday morning that the barn was completely engulfed in flames when his department arrived on the scene at 11 p.m. The fire started and fanned the blaze to the nearby house. The Webbers were not at home at the time. Cause of the blaze was not determined by noon. The family lost all the possessions in the conflagration. In addition to household goods the barn contained a motor boat and motor and supplies. The building was not used to house livestock.

Safecrackers hit the Alfred Atwood Central School for an undetermined sum ranging between \$200 and \$300 early Saturday morning. The yeggs entered the building sometime between midnight and daylight Saturday by breaking a window in the rear of the building. They borrowed an acetelyn torch, hammers and chisels from the shop classroom and burned through the safe located in the principal's office. The activity was hidden from passersby when the thieves covered the office windows with curtains torn from the auditorium. In addition to

this they constructed a tent around the safe to minimize torch glare. A daring daylight burglar continued to harass householders in the same general area of Wellsville when he attempted to enter a home on East Fassett Street Saturday afternoon. One apartment was entered Friday afternoon and two others were victims of attempted breaks. Hornell police report the similar situation where \$180 was taken from a home during the daylight. Homemakers are warned to watch their purses while shopping with grocery carts

in food stores in these areas. The Andover School Board authorized the appointment of Mariann Cooper as teacher of the fifth grade to replace Dianne Conde, who had resigned. Mrs. Cooper, a resident of Alfred Station, had previously taught in Indiana for two years. Other appointments included Doris Mulconery to the post of secretary to Supervising Principal James H. Kessler and John Bridge account clerk. The Board accepted "with regret" the resignation of Agnes Taylor as school secretary.

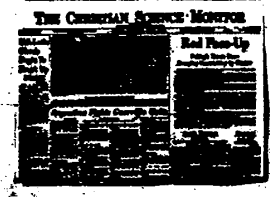
