

Greenwood Central School News

At the regular meeting of the Greenwood Central School Board of Education, held on January 10 with all members present, the following business of general interest to the community was discussed. A motion was made to reinvest school money and surplus money available from January state aid in treasury bills available through the local bank. Principal Hoagland reported that forms had been received from Albany so that applications for projects under the schools Federal grant could be made. It was also reported that a request for a visit from the Educational Planning Facility at Albany had been made and that a definite date had not been established as yet. This visit will need to be made as the next step considering possible improvement to our school facilities.

It was reported that the Jasper Central School would be interested in sharing a woman physical educational teacher next year through the Cooperative Educational Services.

Virginia York was granted a leave of absence from her present elementary position effective September 1966 to enable her to accept a position in the Greenwood Central School as curriculum coordinator, development and remedial reading teacher, and it was also indicated she would be appointed curriculum coordinator in grades K-6 for the balance of the present school year.

Jeff Hibbard was granted permission to represent the school at New York State Regional Education Conference at Rochester, N.Y. and was granted to attend the National Conference of School Superintendents at Atlantic City.

It was reported that safety glasses and goggles have arrived and are in compliance with the new state regulation and that climbing ropes have been installed in the gym.

A request from Troupsburg Central School to send two students to our cooperative special education class was discussed and granted.

At a luncheon meeting at the Sherwood Hotel in Hornell, Thursday, January 13th, the Steuben-Allegany Real Estate Board had their annual meeting for policies and election of officers for the coming year.

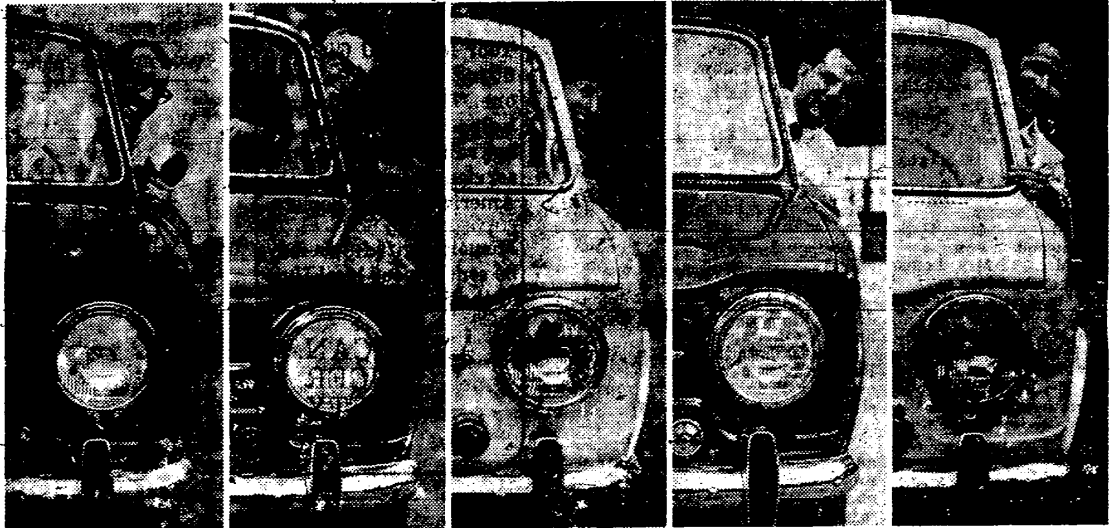

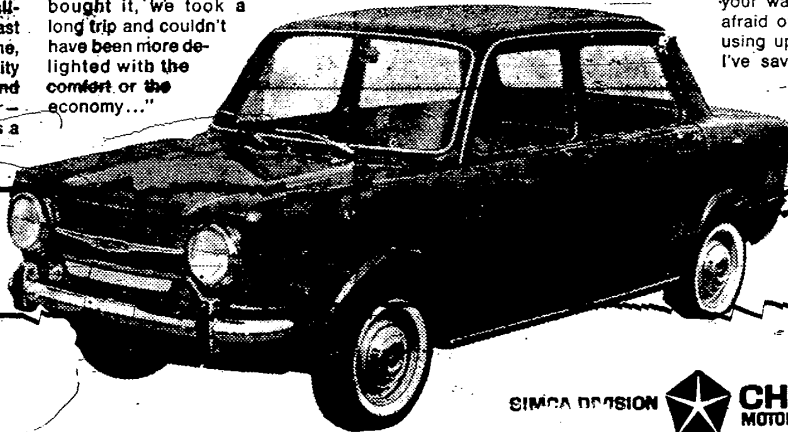
