Donna Brown Wins Betty Crocker Award

Andover Central's 1966 Betty Crocker Homemaker of Tomorrow is Donna L. Brown. She received the highest score in a written examination taken by the senior girls, December 7, 1965, and is now eligible for state and national scholarship awards.

Test papers of all school winners in the state are being judged, and a State Homemaker of Tomorrow and runner-up will be selected soon.

The State Homemaker of Tomorrow will receive a \$1,500 scholarship, and the school will be awarded a complete set of the Encyclopedia Britannica by Encyclopaedia Britannica.

Next spring, the State Betty Crocker Homemaker of Tomorrow from every state and the District of Columbia, each accompanied by a school advisor, will join in an expenses-paid educational tour of Colonial Williamsburg, Virginia and Washington, D. C.

The Betty Crocker Search for the American Homemaker of Tomorrow was instituted by General Mills in 1954-55 to emphasize the importance of homemaking as a career.

Preparation of the test and selection of Homemakers of Tomorrow is in the hands of Science Research Associates, Chicago, educational testing and publishing company.
