Girl Scout Cookie Sale To Start Friday Feb. 25th

Frank Hamm, Jr., Steuben Girl Scout Cookie Sale Chairman, announces that the annual Junior and Cadette Girl Scout Cookie Sale will be off the ground at four o'clock Friday, February 25. Junior and Cadette Girl Scouts will be taking orders until March 5 thru out the new Girl Scout Council. The Councils jurisdiction includes Steuben and Allegany Counties from Beaver Valley to Bolivar.

This year the Girl Scouts will have a new cookie—Sugar Wafers; and as before, Chocolate Vanilla Sandwich Cremes, Thin Mint Cookies, Sugared Shortbread, and Peanut Butter Patties. All cookies sell for 40c a box.

Girl Scouts selling cookies means many things to the girls. It means money for individual troop treasuries; it is training for correct business procedures, it is helping all other Girl Scouts in our Council to have more complete camping facilities at Camp Misty Hollow and Camp White Oaks in Corning, Camp Gremer in Canisteo, Camp Cooper in Bath and Camp Owaissa in Wellsville. This year the Troop Camp Committee has asked for money from the Cookie Sale to provide troop camp equipment which will be placed throughout the Council easily accessible for girls who wish to go camping.

Last year the Girl Scouts of the Steuben Council sold 42,000 boxes of cookies. The proceeds from previous years cookie sales has made it possible for the Council to buy the land for Misty Hollow Camp, to develop the property by putting in a road, tapping springs for water supply, two fire ponds for water supply, two fire ponds a lake for boating, an activities lodge, and two unit sites, accommodating 20 girls each, consisting of a pavilion and six raised tent platforms.

John is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Leo Horan of Barney St., Andover.

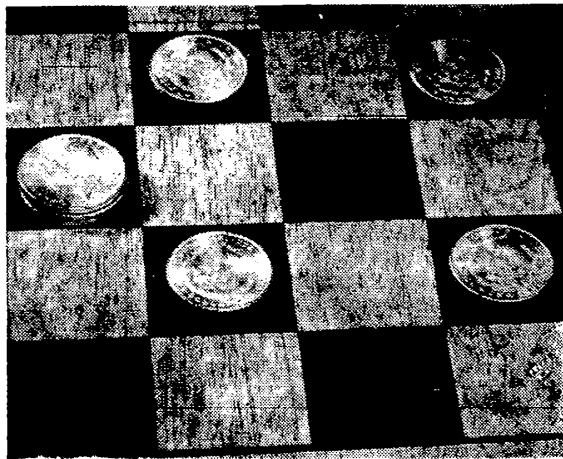
