Police School To Be Held

Chautauqua County Sheriff Merle A. Campaign announced recently that a Basic Training School for Police Officers is scheduled to begin in Mayville on March 7.

The course of study will cover a four weeks' period, providing a total of 160 hours of training. The area from which men are expected to enroll includes the counties of Chautauqua, Cattaraugus and Allegany.

Instructors for the course will be representatives of the FBI, the Chautauqua County Sheriff's Department, Jamestown Police Department, American Red Cross, Chautauqua County Probation Department, and the District Attorney's Office.

The course is certified for credit by the Municipal Police Training Council as a part of the Statewide program from which approximately 5,400 police officers have now graduated.
