Friday, April 8, at 8:30 A. 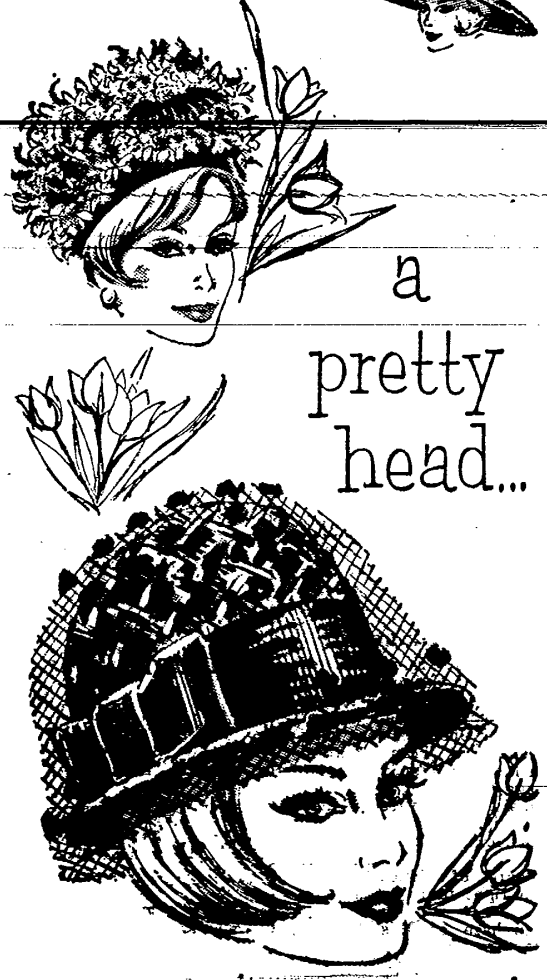
