Boating Guide Now Available

"The Grand Canal", a comprehensive cruising guide of the Erie Canal and its connecting waterways will be ready for sale by Memorial Day, the traditional start of the boating season, the State Conservation Department has announced.

Representing the first complete cruising chart kit of the major Albany to Buffalo water route, the guide consists of detailed navigation charts and a companion book listing information on marine facilities, historic sites and points of interest along the cruise route. The two books are packaged in a water repellent vinyl carrying case.

Completion of "The Grand Canal" marks the second cruising kit prepared by the Department's Division of Motor Boats as part of a program to provide detailed information on the State's major recreational boating routes. The program was initiated in 1965 with publication of "The Northwest Passage" covering the Hudson River, Champlain Canal and Lake Champlain.

Cost of "The Grand Canal" cruising guide is \$5.00. It may be ordered from the New York State Conservation Department, Division of Motor Boats, Albany, New York 12226. Limited supplies of "The Northwest Passage" are also available on a first come-first served basis.

Don't Drive After Drinking!

Leave Wild Animals At Home — In Woods!

Persons on springtime excursions through fields and woodlands are cautioned against "adopting" baby wild birds and animals they may find.

In its annual appeal to discourage animal-napping, the State Conservation Department reminds well-intentioned "foster parents" that it is a misdemeanor to cap-

ture and keep wild animals. In addition, it can be dangerous.

Humans find it difficult to understand nature's baby sitting service, which is one of concealment. The majority of the young animals found in the woods are not orphans. A mother will hide her young and then move off to a safe distance so she doesn't attract predators. In the case of rabbits, a doe seldom visits her litter more than once or twice a day to see

how they're doing. Until the animals are weaned, they stay, for the most part, unattended in or near the nest.

The Department pointed out that the adoption of baby deer is especially dangerous. Young fawns have been known to seriously injure children by butting or striking playfully with their sharp hooves.

Although the temptation to adopt woodland animals is great,

the Department suggests watching or photographing — but don't take them home.
