Mental Health Drive To Commence June 1st

Although May is officially designated as National Mental Health Month, the campaign in Allegany County will not be launched until June 1st. Mrs. Raymond Slade is Allegany County chairman and Jack Dixon will head the drive in Andover. The list of solicitors will be published in next week's News. Collections will be made for the period June 1st through June 15th, with June 30th as the definite deadline.

Seventy-five percent of funds received remain in Allegany County. This money supports the Consultation Service — a group of three qualified psychologists who are available for counseling on marital, family and other problems. The service meets every Monday night in the Jones Memorial Clinic rooms. Funds have also been contributed to the Allegany County Association for Retarded children enabling ten children to spend a week at Camp Cornplanter in Kinzua, Pa.

Last year an impressive amount of money was collected in Andover. This amount definitely eclipsed sums collected in the other twenty four towns in which similar drives are conducted. It is hoped that we can do as well or better in Andover this year!
