

### N.Y.S. Bass And Muskalonge Season Open

New York's bass and muskalonge fishermen were reminded today that the statewide season on the two popular sport fish started Saturday, June 18 — nearly two weeks earlier than the traditional July 1 opening of previous seasons.

A major revision of the Conservation Law in 1965 provides for the opening of the bass and muskie seasons on the third Saturday in June; the Conservation Department said.

In addition to providing a uniform opening date for bass and muskalonge waters throughout the state, the June 18 opening coincides with the start of the Canadian seasons in the St. Lawrence River. On most New York waters, the June 18 opening gives anglers nearly two weeks of extra fishing.

The uniform Saturday opening of the season provides more equal opportunity for anglers to participate in "opening day".

Fishermen are urged to check the official "Hunting, Trapping, Fishing Guide" for size and catch limits and several minor exceptions. In Lake George, for instance, the bass season starts August 1, and in several trout waters the bass season coincides with the April 1 opening of the trout season.

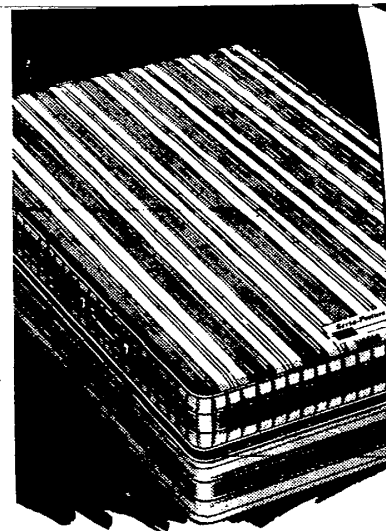
