**July Farm Milk Price At \$4.75**

Dairy farmers will receive a uniform farm price of \$4.75 per hundredweight (46.5 quarts) for July milk deliveries to pool handlers in the New York-New Jersey milkshed. Dr. A. J. Pollard, market administrator has announced. The June price was \$4.22; dairy-men got \$4.10 per hundredweight in July, 1965.

The producer butterfat differential will be computed at 6.4 cents for each tenth of a pound of fat above or below the 3.5 percent standard.

Dr. Pollard reported that receipts from producers totaled 204,061,133 pounds, 43,924,888 pounds, or 4.6 percent, under the 947,986,021 pounds received in July, 1965. Sales of fluid milk (Class I), he said, declined 3.507 percent, from 465,795,019 pounds to 219 pounds, or nearly one per 42,287,800 pounds.

Fluid sale made up 51.1 percent of the July pool, compared to 49.1 percent in July, 1965. The price handlers paid for milk received in the 201-210 mile zone in July and used as Class I was \$5.47 per hundredweight.

The administrator said the number of producers was down 3,534 to 3,156 but average deliveries per day per dairy increased 37 pounds to 807 pounds. A drop of 29 to 252 was recorded in the number of handlers reported used in computing the pool.

Receipts in bulk units, he said, amounted to 47,254,917 pounds or 41,228,187 pounds more than a year ago. Bulk milk made up 19.4 percent of the pool, compared to 41.2 percent in July, 1965.

The number of bulk producers rose 1,207 to 12,287 and the number of units increased by 12 to 519.

The farm value of July receipts which Dr. Pollard pointed out does not include all the differentials paid to dairy farmers, totaled \$45,593,552.40.

The uniform farm price of \$4.75 per hundredweight will be paid for milk testing 3.5 percent butterfat and received within 201-210 miles of New York City.
