A Town of Hartsville landmark, the abandoned church-at the intersection of the Hartsville Hill and Crosby Creek roads, burned to the ground ear'y Thursday morning, August 18th. The cause of the fire, discovered at 3:50 a. m., by Raymend Tucker, is unknown. Mr. Tucker ran a quarter of a mile to telephone an alarm, but by the time firemen from Alfred and Alfred Station arrived only the framework of the church was left. The church built more than 100 years ago, was located at the top of the steep Hartsville Hill road above Alfred Station. Originally a Seventh Day Baptist Church, it was later used by other denominations until its abandonment in the early 1930's. The property now belongs to the Allie Burdick estate.
