A Town of Hartsville landmark, the abandoned church at the intersection of the Hartsville Hill and Crosby Creek roads, burned to the ground early Thursday morning, August 18th. The cause of the fire, discovered at 3:50 a. m., by Raymond Tucker, is unknown. Mr. Tucker ran a quarter of a mile to telephone an alarm, but by the time firemen from Alfred and Alfred Station arrived only the framework of the church was left. The church built more than 100 years ago, was located at the top of the steep Hartsville Hill road above Alfred Station. Originally a Seventh Day Baptist Church, it was later used by other denominations until its abandonment in the early 1930's. The property now belongs to the Allie Burdick estate.

Entries will be judged at 1 p. m., September 1 and are not to be removed until the close of the Pomona session at 3 p. m., Sept. 2. The entry fee is 20c per entry. Allegany County Farm Bureau directors began plans for the annual meeting at the board meeting Monday night in Friendship. Arthur Roeske of Andover was named chairman of the nominating committee. The final event on the fair scheduled was the free-for-all horse pull which was won by Charles Lawrence of Almond. He was also awarded the teamsters prize. Claude Lunn of Bolivar placed second and Vincent Mid- daugh of Scio, third.
