**Special Wild Turkey Season In Catskills**

The 1966 special wild turkey season in the Catskills will be longer, cover more territory, and be open to more sportsmen than ever before, the State Conservation Department has announced.

Last year's five-day season has been lengthened to a full week Oct. 3 - 9. Four counties — Delaware, Greene, Otsego and Schoharie — will be completely open to hunters, who were restricted to portions of three counties in 1965. And last season's quota of 750 hunters has been removed, so that any number of sportsmen may receive special wild turkey hunting permits.

In another change of procedure the Department will not establish check-stations this year. However each successful hunter must send in one leg of his prize to the Department's regional game office in Stamford. These will be used to survey the age and sex of the season's take.

Hunters who take banded turkeys, or birds with miniature radio transmitters attached, should re-

Sportsmen interested in hunting this wary game bird may get details and applications from John J. Whalen, Conservation Department Regional Game Manager, Stamford. An applicant must submit his name, home address, and the number from his 1866-67 small game hunting license. Applications will be accepted from Sept. 15 through Oct. 5.
