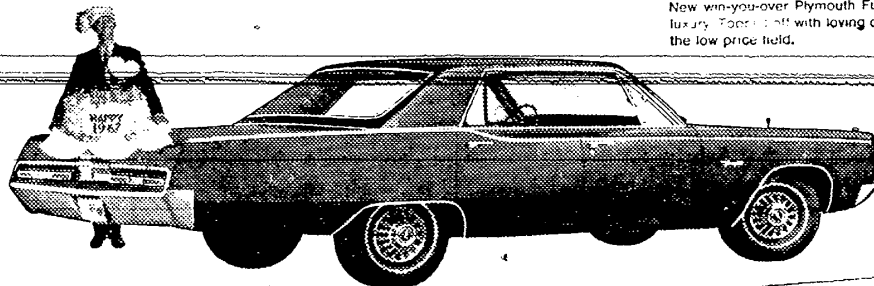
Mr. and Mrs. Nelson Hawkins of Bath were Sunday dinner guests of her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Stanley Murray.

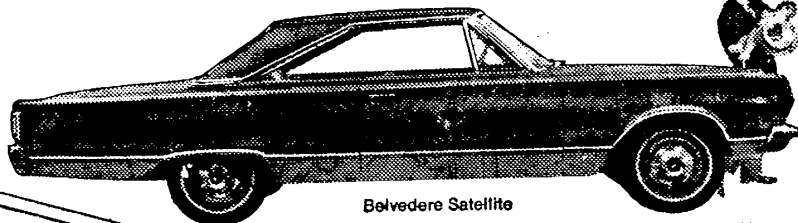

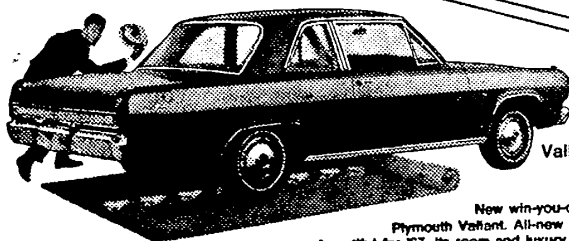


Fury III—4 Door Hardtop
