PSAT Test

The Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test was administered on Tuesday, October 18, by Mr. Russell to thirty juniors and seniors.

The PSAT is a two-hour version of the College Board's three-hour Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT). The test measures scholastic ability, verbal and mathematical. Since PSAT scores are returned to the schools in December, they can provide information which can help students in making plans for college early in the school year. These scores are used in conjunction with the students' academic records to help the student make realistic decisions about which college to enter.

The PSAT is also used as a basis for the National Honor Society Scholarship.
