Mailing News For The Armed Forces Overseas

The period October 21 to November 10th has been designated for mailing Christmas parcels and greeting cards by surface transportation to members of our Armed Forces overseas. For mailing Air Parcels the period is from Dec. 1st to Dec. 10th. Greeting cards for the Armed Forces overseas should be mailed within the periods designed for the parcels if they are to have reasonable expectation of delivery prior to Christmas.

Those who are planning to send Christmas gifts in addition to Christmas cards and letters should check at the Post Office regarding size and weight limitations and the best method of packing gifts for delivery. A Customs Declaration form numbers 2966 and 2976 are required on parcels to many destinations and have to be completed by the sender at the time of mailing. Each package should be well wrapped and tied with string. Sufficient cushioning material should be used to prevent any rattling or loosening of articles within the package.

Be sure your addresses are legible and complete, and they should always be clearly written, printed or better yet typewritten. All APO numbers have been changed to five digits which are identical to the ZIP CODE.
