## "Rocky" Wins Third Term As Governor

Nelson A. Rockefeller was returned to office as Governor of the State of New York for his third four-year term in Tuesday's election.

Charles E. Goodell was re-elected Representative to Congress; James Hastings as State Senator; and Frank Walkely as Member of the Assembly.

Countywide, Helen S. Ackerman, endorsed by both major parties, was re-elected County Clerk and Edwin F. Comstock and Robert G. Eisenhardt, Republicans, were named Coroners.

On the local scene, Dr. Phil Crawford ran well ahead of the other Democrats on the ticket but failed in his bid to represent Allegany County in the forthcoming Constitutional Convention.

### News That's Print To Fit

It is with deep regret that we note the passing of Robert O'Boyle, a former Andover resident until World War II.

"Bob" or "Windy" as he was known by his friends, worked at Sackett's Food Market for several years and was engaged to Dawn Sequin who was teaching at Andover Central School when we met them.

"Bob" and Dawn were married around 1942 and then he was called into the Armed Forces around the same time that we were in late '42 or early '43, in fact, "Bob" was stationed at Camp Edwards, Mass., during the early spring of '43 where we met several times and talked over things in the old home town.

After the war was over, "Bob" and Dawn moved up to Rouses Point near her family where she taught in the local School System and "Bob" ran a hardware and general store for her folks.

Later on, "Bob" was employed by the Railroad in that area and was still serving in that capacity the last time that we were guests in their home. He was also a Past Post Commander in the local Legion Post there and was very active in Legion activities.

Around two years ago we understand that "Bob" had a serious heart attack and has been in poor health since then.

We wish to express our sympathy as well as all of the old friends in Andover to "Bob's" wife and their families.

Well, now that Election is over with perhaps things can get back to normal.

However, there are a few points of interest resulting from the election that we think are worthy of note.

In the Town of Andover among the registered enrolled voters, there are 113 Democrats consisting of around 11% — and of these 87% voted.

There are 387 Republicans consisting of around 36% of the voters — and of these — 80% voted.

However, the appalling feature is that there are 555 Voters listed as No Party Designation — which make up around 53% of the total vote — and of these — only 43% voted.

In other words, less than 1/2 of the largest group of eligible voters actually went to the polls to cast their ballot.

Another thing that seemed rather strange was the fact that the Republican Party didn't even have a party headquarters to work from to help get out the vote to support the party on a State-wide front.

Can it be that the people running the local party are only interested in election — at the local level? Are they all good loyal Republicans? Or is the majority of them so interested in their own personal lives that they don't have the time to devote to "the Grand Old Party?"

If the latter is the case — it seems as if it is about time to do a little re-organizing — and get some new blood in that will take an active interest. From the looks on the surface, just a few people have been carrying the load for a long, long time — and have ended up getting a kick in the wrong place for all of their efforts.

And having been a duly registered enrolled Republican voter since starting to vote, the writer feels that this should be brought to the attention of all local Republicans.

Something else we noted — and don't know how long it has been there — The Local Grange is sporting a new sign out in front of their Grange Hall! Looks nice too.

### When Does YOUR Auto Registration Expire

Motor Vehicle Commissioner William S. Huits had this reminder for New York State motorists today:

If your automobile or truck is a 1961 model and its 1966 registration expires at the end of this month, you must have it inspected before you can renew the registration for the next year.

If, however, it is a later model, you may renew the registration without having it inspected beforehand. The safety-check must be performed early in 1967, through according to this schedule:

- 1962's and 1963's — before May 1;
- 1964's — before June 1;
- 1965's — before July 1;
- 1966's — before August 1.

The Commissioner also pointed out that beginning with December registration expirations, all motor vehicles, regardless of their model years, must undergo the periodic inspection before they can be registered for the next year. These inspections may be done at any time between now and renewal.

New 1967 models must be inspected by the dealer before the owner can register them.
