ident. The board members were introduced and new teachers were recognized. Following the dinner the President of the Board of Education, Lloyd Chaffee spoke briefly.

Tuesday evening, November 8th the school observed Open House from 7:30 until 9:30. At this time parents were able to discuss their child's work. There was a spelling bee for grades 4, 5, and 6th and a full length movie in the cafeteria for the benefit of the children who accompanied their parents.

The State has notified the Greenwood Central School of a change in the lunch program. Lunches will be reduced from 20 to 15 cents, Kindergarten through 6 and 25 to 20 cents, 7 through 12. This became effective Tuesday, November 1st.

Since the earlier days Miss Droppa has been active in the Khamgaon Girls' Boarding School with its 135 boarding girls and another-50, who came for the day. This has been a tremendous challenge in these years when the church struggled to become self-supporting and self-propagating. But many of them have learned that they, too, can learn to trust: God like the church in America had done for many years while they send out their missionaries.

The other Missionary that will be with us during the Convention will be the Rev. Floyd Bowman.

The ministry of Rev. Floyd Bowman reaches from Ohio to Timbuktu. From his childhood home in Ohio he went to Fort Wayne, Indiana, where he began his preparation for the ministry in the Fort Wayne Bible College. Having finished the course there,

he went for a further year of training to the Nyack Missionary College, Nyack, N. Y.

Mr. Bowman's first assignment in the ministry was in Poughkeepsie, N. Y. He was the first pastor of what was to become a growing church. From there he went to France for language study and then to Africa. While serving the Lord and the mission in Timbuktu he married Miss Dorothy Hus, who labored with the mission at Bobo-Dioulasso. Together they entered upon their work among the Mohammedan Tuaregs known as the "People of the Veil". Now they have three sons on the mission field, and their youngest son is presently studying at the Nyack Missionary College.

Rev. Bowman will speak at the Andover Christian & Missionary Alliance Church from November 10th to 13th at 7:30 p. m.
