An International Quarter Horse Show, the 15th annual, will be held as a pre-show opening event November 17 to 20. More than 600 entries of this popular western type pleasure and working horse have been registered. It is one of the two largest Quarter Horse Shows in the country.

Record Entries Predicted

Final tabulations of the 1966 entry have not yet been completed, but show officials predict record high turnouts in many divisions based on the heavy volume of early entries received.

Championship Rodeo competition will be staged in conjunction with all 14 of the International Horse Shows that are scheduled during the run of the Exposition. Rough-riding cowboy contestants will compete in the five main competitive events: Saddle Bronc rid-

ing, Bareback Bronc Riding, Calf Roping, Steer Wrestling, and Brahma Bull Riding.

Fast action girl barrel racing events will also feature each performance of the International Rodeo, which will be directed by Tommy Steiner, of Austin, Texas.

Named To Farmers Home Administration County Committee

John J. Mulligan, R.D. 1, Belmont, has been appointed to the Allegany County Farmers Home Administration Advisory Committee, it has been announced by Committee Chairman, Max G. Coleman, Jr., of Wellsville. The local office of the Farmers Home Administration is located in the Post Office Building, Wellsville, New York.

Mr. Mulligan was appointed to succeed Harold C. Snyder of Alfred, whose term expired June 30. Mr. Mulligan operates a successful dairy and sheep farm with

his father, Paul Mulligan. They have a herd of fifty Holstein milk cows and run five hundred head of sheep. Mr. Mulligan is a member of the ASCS Community Committee and is on the Extension Service Livestock Committee.

The practical experience of the new member will enable him to make a real contribution to the county committee's actions when they review loan applications.

The major function of the County Committee consists of determining the eligibility of applicants for different loans made by the Farmers Home Administration such as loans for the purchasing and refinancing of farms, cattle and machinery under the Farm Ownership and Operating Loan Programs; for the construction, repair, or purchase of homes by rural residents or residents of villages under 5,500 population under the Rural Housing Program and for loans to individuals with low incomes for a small business or a service that will increase their income under the Economic Op-

portunity Act of 1964. The County Committee establishes the maximum credit that can be extended. They make recommendations concerning loans to as-

sociations for the development of recreational facilities, water supply systems, and sewer systems for the benefit of rural area and communities.
