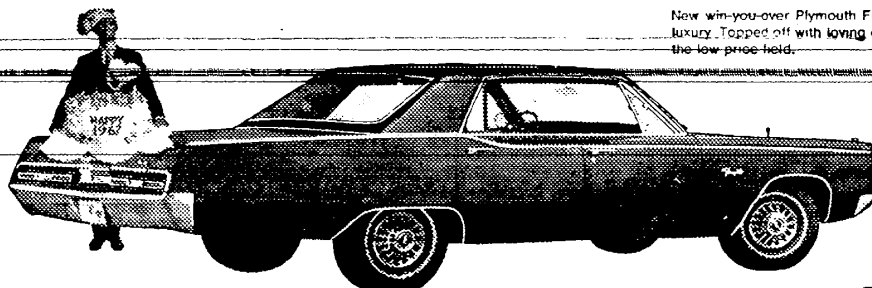

Greenwood Central School**

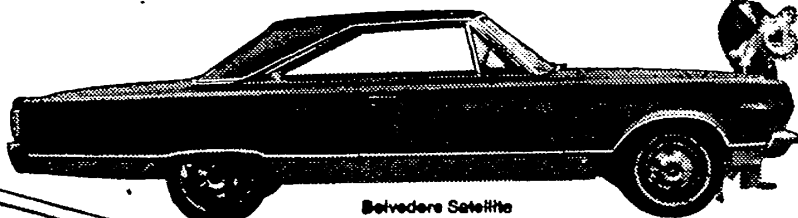

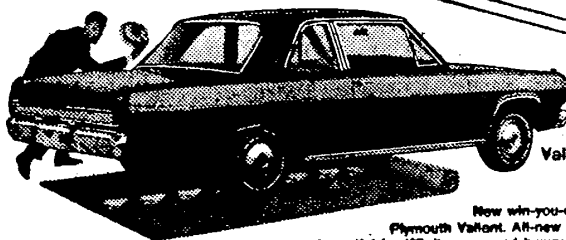
