Mary DeRemer Wins Bausch And Lomb Science Award

Throughout the United States, educators recognize the Annual Bausch and Lomb Honorary Science Award as evidence of superior scientific aptitude. In announcing Mary DeRemer as the 1967 winner, Principal James Kessler said, "These awards, are especially significant. Today, everyone realizes the importance of the study of science in our secondary schools. The Bausch and Lomb Honorary Science Award provides recognition to senior students with the highest scholastic standing in science subjects".

The Science Award — a handsome bronze medal — is presented at graduation in more than 8,500 schools. Since its introduction in 1933, there have been 195,000 winners. Surveys have indicated that more than 30% of the winners have been encouraged by the award to follow scientific careers. Winners of the Honorary Science Award are eligible to compete for Science Scholarships, at the University of Rochester. Three or more Scholarships are sponsored by Bausch and Lomb; the University provides an even greater number. Stipends are based on need and have a total combined four-year value of about \$50,000. The award winner is selected early so that her application for the scholarship competition can be filled out and returned to the University before the January 15 deadline.

The Bausch and Lomb Science Award and Scholarship Programs have been officially approved by the National Association of Secondary School Principals.

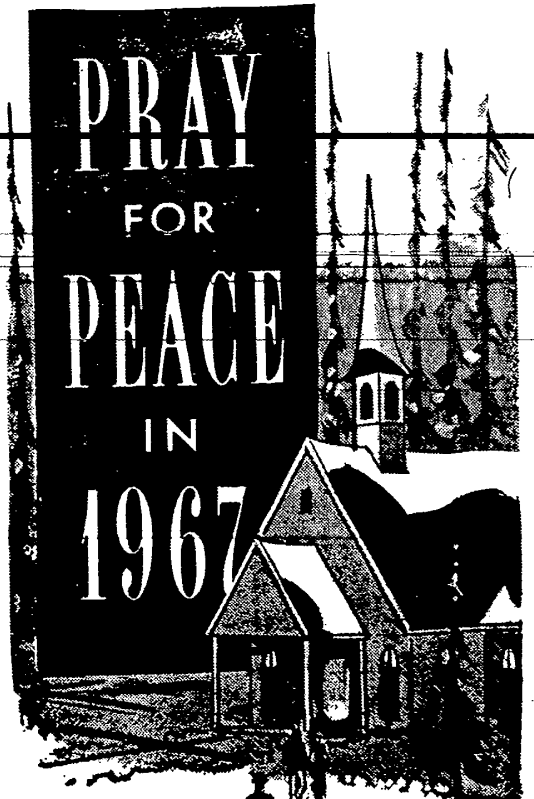

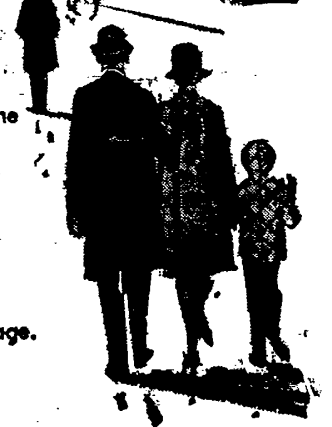
