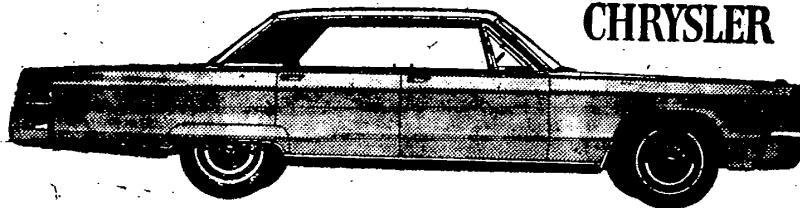
If license and tags are to be mailed, a self-addressed stamped envelope should be included. Checks should be made payable to the Town Clerk.

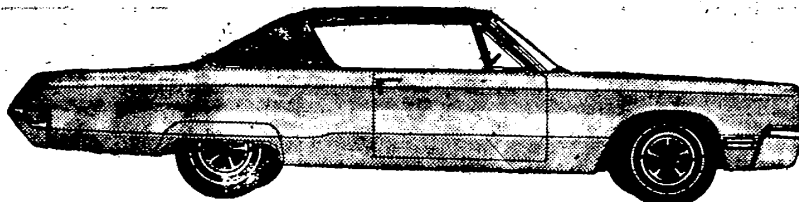

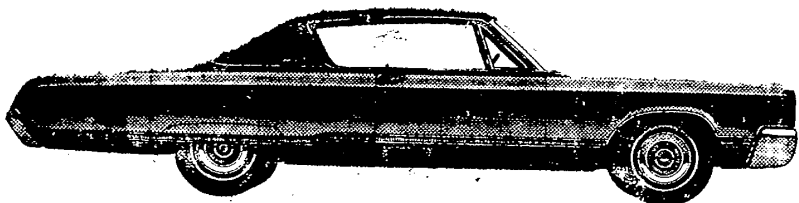

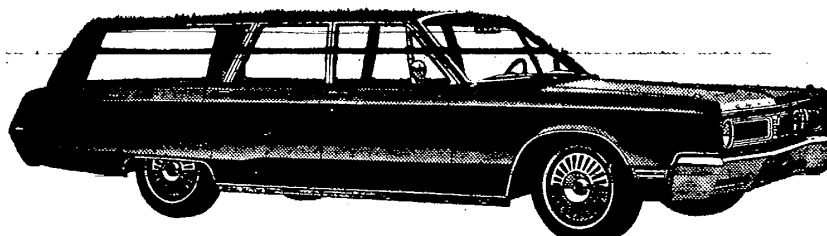
