



SOCIAL NOTES

Mrs. John Nobles entertained the members of the L.L. Bridge Club at her home Thursday evening, January 5th at a 7:30 dessert. Honors were presented to Mrs. Frank Holmes and Mrs. Avery Mead.

Bayard C. Tullar, president of the Tullar Field Association presented the deed to the field to Wellsville's Mayor Robert Gardner Friday, January 6th. The Commission gifted the village the property for recreational use by the Recreation Commission. The village purchased fronting land and buildings and will construct a combination fire, police and recreation facilities on the site. The new building will replace the current structure doomed by the Rt. 17 bypass.

Lack of a telephone was blamed for the flattening of a farmhouse on Beach Hill near Whitesville on Saturday morning. The building owned by Miss Edna Silvermail, was completely demolished before local firemen arrived at the scene. The fire apparently started in an overheated chimney.

A safe in the office of the Seio Central School was smashed open, and some \$400 in cash taken from it Monday night by thieves.

At the Tuesday, January 3rd meeting of the Allegany County Board of Supervisors, Benson L. Smith, supervisor of the Town of Cuba, was re-elected as board chairman for his sixth consecutive term. The supervisors also re-elected Manley Ackerman of Wellsville, clerk of the board and Frances Barnes, Richburg, as journal clerk. Ackerman has served since 1958 and Mrs. Barnes since 1957. Supervisor Clarence R. Shaner of Bolivar assumed his duties at this meeting. He is the only new supervisor named to the board as a result of the November General Election.

Two renovation and addition construction projects having a combined value of \$150,000 have been completed at the State University.

Agricultural and Technical College at Alfred. The renovation work in the college dairy barn, adding a sweet water cooler room, a process boiler room and a bulk tank milk storage room, has been completed as has the administrative office facilities in the lower level area of the library.

Wellsville Veterans And Moose Clubs Burglarized

Brazen thieves looted four safes two cigarette machines and one bowling machine of nearly \$4,000 in two separate breaks in Wellsville early Thursday morning.

The Moose Club, Maple Ave., was hit for approximately \$1,200 and the Veterans of Foreign Wars Club, also on Maple Ave., losses were estimated at more than \$2,500. Police theorize the VFW was struck first by the thirsty bandits who consumed a quantity of beer and nearly a quart of orange juice as they calmly flopped the safes on their backs and pried open the doors. The cigarette machines were each opened in a similar manner with one twist of a pry bar. Many of the tools used in the heists were left in the Moose Club.

The breaks were discovered shortly after 8 Thursday morning when the clubs were opened in preparation for the day's business.

Theodore Cocco Pleds Not Guilty

Theodore N. Cocco, whose last known address was Salt Rising Road, Bolivar, pled not guilty to burglary third degree and grand larceny, first. County Judge William W. Serra returned him to the County Jail in lieu of \$5,000 property bail to await the trial term of the County Court. Cocco had been accused of taking approximately \$800 worth of materials from the Andover Water and Light Plant. He was arraigned Dec. 27 but asked for a postponement and that an attorney be assigned to him. The Court appointed Philip Engelder of Wellsville as his counsel.
