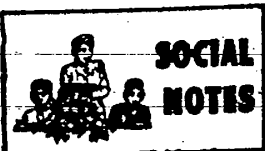
Received a letter a few days ago from my friend, Hazel Shear, who is the County Historian. She sent me some Andover information. Every little bit helps!

Unemployment Tax Forms May Be Late

Some employers may receive forms they need to report Federal unemployment taxes several days later than usual, John E. Foley, District Director of Internal Revenue, said today.

All employers, however, should receive the forms in advance of the January 31 filing deadline for this tax, Mr. Foley said.

Copies of Form 940 required to report and pay Federal unemployment taxes are now available at the District office of the Internal Revenue Service in Buffalo for any employer who did not get his copy in the mail.

Mr. Foley said the delay in mailing Form 940 relates only to unemployment taxes and does not affect individual or business income tax returns. Mailing of income tax forms has already been completed.
