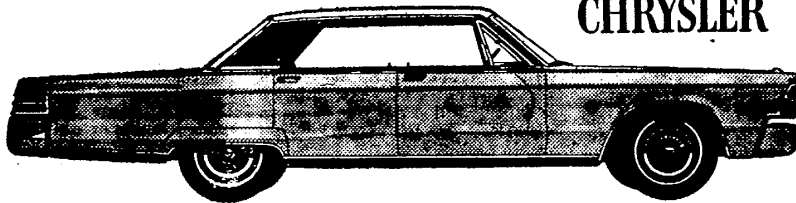
During the intermission at half-time, a baked goods auction will be held sponsored by the Teacher's Association. If you wish to contribute to this, you may bring your baked goods to the school and

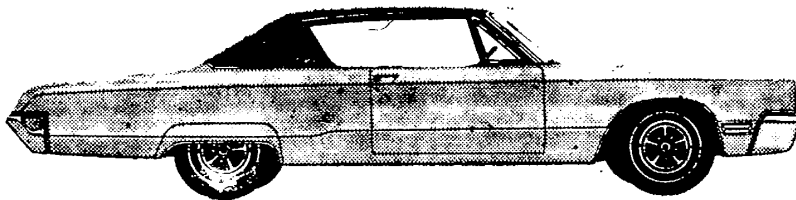

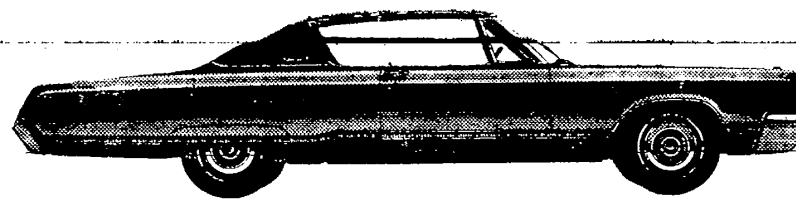
