Burglars made an unsuccessful attempt to rob the Greenwood Office of the First State Bank of Canisteo Wednesday night. Mrs. Betty Zeltwanger notified the Canisteo Bank and the FBI was called to aid Steuben County Sheriff's Department. Entry was made through a back window. Two holes were drilled on the side of the vault. Nothing was taken from the bank and it was assumed the burglars were frightened away. County road men were loading sand back of the store. Rodney Cook and Emmett Harkenrider may have been of help in tracking down the men as they noticed an out-of-county car parked in town and later saw the same car by the Rexville Post Office in the middle of the night so they notified the Sheriff's Office. John Donovan of Johnson City and Walter Scribner of Middletown were arrested Thursday night in Wellsville. A witness saw the men dump mail bags and tools in the Genesee River. The Addison Post Office was broken into and robbed of cash and stamps valued to \$7300 the same night as the local bank. The Greenwood Bank Vault was built with a 21-inch lining of cement making it quite burglar proof. The safe door faces the large front window and has a time lock.

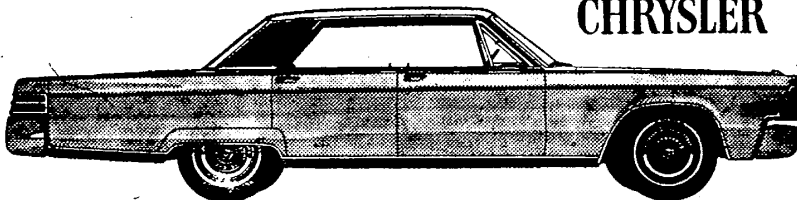

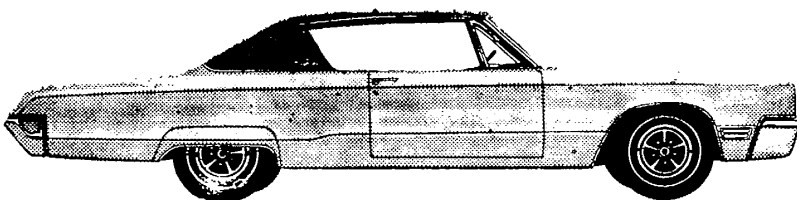

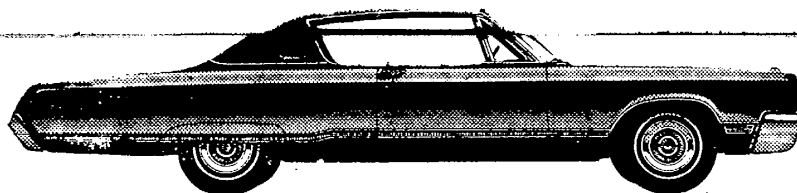
