Eight Andover Seniors Win Scholarship Awards

From a graduating class of thirty-six, eight Seniors or approximately twenty-two percent of the c.ass have won either New York State Regents, or Nursing Scholar ships, or Special Scholarships.

The New York State Education Department announced on Feb. 15, 1967, the names of those high school rupils who have, won Research Swiege Celebrathing.

The Regents Scholarship Examinstion for these scholarships was written by approximately 160,000 high school seniors in about 1,200 secondary schools of the State on October 4, 1966.

There are a total of 18,743 Regents College Scholarships awarded this year.

The number allocated to each total to the school of the schoo

courty is determined by the ratio of the number of high school graduates in each county to the total number of high school graduates in the State last year.

Allegany County received 61 Schelarships, with Dale R. Angood, 57 Greenwey St., Andover, being 4th highest in the County with a secre of 259.

The holder of one of these schol archips will be entitled to an

annual award of \$250 to \$1,000 annual award of \$250 to \$1,000 depending on financial need, for each of four years of his college course while attending any college in the State of New York approved by the Regents for this purposs. In taddition, scholarship holders may be eligible to receive scholar incestive awards of \$100 to \$500 up to the cost of tuition.

The holder of one of these schol arships will be entitled to an annual award of \$200 to \$500 a year, depending on financial need for each year of study in a registered professional nursing course.
