More than 300 persons, representing the medical sciences of Western New York, Erie, Pa., and Canada, are expected to be in Niagara Falls, N. Y., March 4th to attend the 21st annual Clinic Day sponsored by the Academy of Medicine beginning at 9 a. m. at the Parkway Inn.

Dr. Maria Crea-Smith, of Niagara Falls, chairman of the seminar said five nationally known authorities will discuss "Clinical Considerations of Blood and Bleeding Problems". A 3:30 p. m. panel discussion will be moderated by Dr. Marvin Bloom, associate professor of medicine and director of continuing education in the health sciences at State University of

New York at Buffalo. Participating from the same school will be Dr. Ernest Witebsky, professor and chairman of bacteriology and immunology.

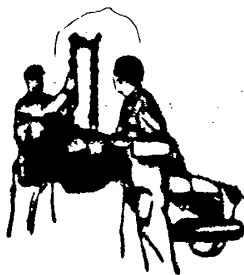
