Following are the Rules for the 1967 Contest:

ELIGIBILITY: The Grange promotes the contest as a Community Project, by encouraging the FFA, 4-H, School Youth, Grange members and others to compete. Any YOUTH from 14 through 18 years inclusive may enter. Winners of former contests shall NOT compete.

DATE: Entries must be sent to Pomona Grange Lecturer, Mrs. Karen Wilcox, R.D. 1, Almond, N. Y. 14804 by June 1st, 1967.

Scoring:
Classification of Theme — 35%
Originality of Essay — 30%
Composition of Essay — 15%
Good English — 10%
Neatness — 10% Total 100%
ESSAY: Essay should be limited to 750 - 1000 words.

IT MUST be type-written, keeping a copy for contestants records. Name, Age, HOME address, Grange, School and County MUST be on each entry.

TITLE: "Soil and Water Conservation For All Mankind".

AWARDS: A Local and County cash prizes will be given.

B. State Awards:
First — \$25.00, plus a free trip to the State meeting of the Soil Conservation Dist. Ass'n., plus a trip to State Grange one day to read winning Essay and receive cash award.

Second — \$15.00
Third — \$10.00

Sources of Material: Keep in mind farmers and urban co-operators. The Soil Conservation Service work unit leader, Extension Service Agent, District Directors and Vo-Ag Teachers will be able to help with materials and the Conservation Department at Albany, N. Y.
