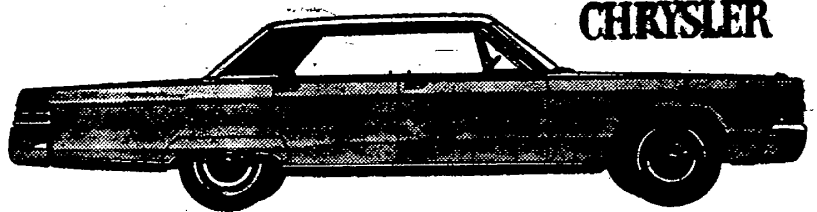
In making the transition from civilian life to Naval service, he received instruction under veteran Navy petty officers. He studied seamanship as well as civility, techniques, military drill and other subjects.

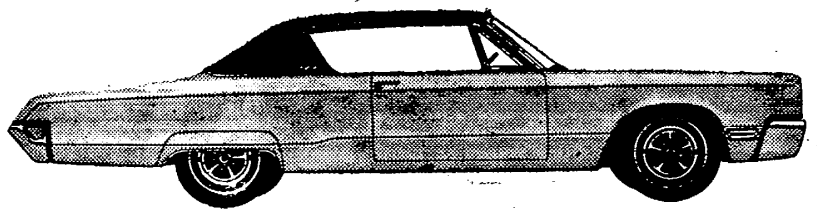

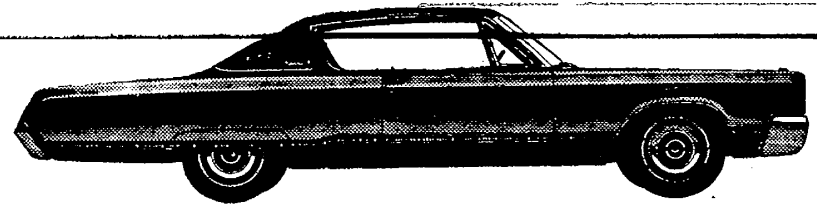
