

475 Votes Cast In Local Election

A total of 475 Voters turned out for Tuesday's Local Village Election despite the miserable snowy weather and slipperv streets, with Republican Candidates making a clean sweep of the election.

Mayor Paul E. Kilbane, unopulsed, received 387 votes.
