A new tomato veriety named New Yorker has been developed at the N. Y. State Agricultural Experiment Station at Geneva. Resistant to Verticillium Wilt, it is an early ripening variety, slightly earlier than Fireball. #### ATTENTION DOG OWNERS

A NIGHT QUARANTINE for dogs is in force in this county. It was laid at the request of the county board of supervisors to help protect livestock from dog damage.

Dogs must be securely confined between sunset and one hour after sunrise. Any peace officer shall kill on sight any dog at large in vio-lation of such order. A dog shall not be deemed to be at large if accompanied by and under the full control of the owner.

Any owner of a dog who shall neglect to confine his dog shall be subject to a penalty of \$10.00. Effective April 1, 1967 to March 31, 1969.
