Cornell Introduces Chicken-Meat Steaks-

New kinds of steaks made entirely of chicken meat have been developed at Cornell University. The convenience items ar called "Breasteaks" and "Dark and White Chiksteaks."

These newest Cornell products were conceived by and perfected under the direction of Profs. Robert C. Baker and Lawrence B. Darrah of the N. Y. State College of Agriculture.

In describing the products. Bak-

In describing the products, Baker said the steaks are 100 per cent edible with no bones or excess fat to worry about. They are made of

to worry about. They are made of solid broiler meat with skin removed.

Each steak is about one-third of an inch thick and rectangular in shape, weighing anywhere from one-quarter to two-thirds of a pound.

The consumer preferring white meat can use "Breasteaks" Those

meat can use "Breasteaks". Those who like dark meat can use "Chik-

who like dark meat can use "Chik-steaks", a combination of thigh-and breast meat.

Dipped into an egg-and-milk batter and corn flake crumbs, the steaks can be either deepfat fried, pan-fried, or baked. They take three to 10 minutes to cook, de-pending on the method of cooking.


