The Annual 4-H Dairy and Livestock dinner will be held at 12:00 Noon at the Belfast Central School on April 29th.

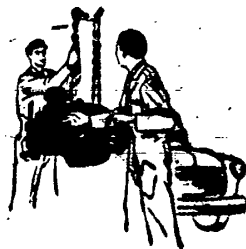
Karl Maki, IFYE delegate, recently from India, will be the featured speaker.
