Social Security News

In a statement made recently r. Leonard J. Dziadkowicz, man-Mr. Leonard J. Dziadkowicz, menager of the Social Security District Office in Olean, N. Y., reminded those who are approaching age 65 that some action may be necessary on their part in order to have the protection of Medicare at the time they reach 65.

Medicare coverge is available

to have the protection of Medicare at the time they reach 65.

Medicare coverage is available to nearly everyone age 65 or over, even if they are still working full time. However, an application is necessary if one has never been made. The enrollment period for signing up for the doctor bill insurance part of Medicare is a 7-month period beginning 3 months before the month of reaching age 65, and continuing for 3 monthy after the month in which age 65 was reached. Mr. Dziadkowicz stressed that this doctor bill insurance coverage can begin with the month of reaching age 65 only if the application for it is made in one of the 3 months before the month of the 65th birthday.




