Allegany and Steuben Counties Routes 408, 70, 70A Work

J. Burch McMorran, State Superintendent of i'ublic Works, has announced receipt of a low bid of \$2,386,832.05 from Hornell Constr. Corp., Hornell, New York for improvements to 5.99 miles of Routes 408, 70, and 70A in Altegany and Steuben Counties. Five clus were received.

Sections of the routes involved will be resurfaced with asphalt concrete from a point 1.1-mile northwest of the Route 408 junction in Allegany County, easterly to Route 36 in Steuben County. A portion of Route 408 will be relocated and a new bridge will be replaced and an enw bridge will be replaced and the Canaseraga Creek. The Bennett Creek bridge will be replaced and the Canaseraga Creek of the Route 70 reconstruction.
