Whether speaking to one person or to a group of persons, there are many things to keep in mind. In order to attain something you

or to a group of persons, there are many things to keep in mind. In order to attain something you want, you must let the person to whom you are speaking see that you are interested in helping him. To begin with it is necessary to create interest in your listener. This can be done by selecting a common basis for discussion. To put your listener more at ease it is good to relate to similar experiences you have had. The most important step however is to make sure your listener knows exactly that you are speaking about. There are two main methods for delivering a talk or speech which are and can be used very effectively. They are "general to particular" and "particular to general". In the first case you start with the main idea and subject of the whole talk and then work into important particulars. The second method is just the opposite.

Always remember to keep the interest or your listener throughout your conversation, make it interesting and beneficial to him but always keep your own goal in mind
