For The Home Gardener

New Cucumbers Fight Disease
New varieties of cucumbers will help this year's growers solve some disease problems, reports Prof. Philip A. Minges, N. Y. State College of Agriculture, Cornell University.

Both mosaic and scab are frequent problems with cucumbers. Mosaic causes vines to turn yellow and die prematurely, or the fruit may become severely mottled. Scab

primarily affects the fruit. Minges said gardeners should select resistant varieties.

Resistant varieties recently released by Cornell scientists are Tablegreen 65 and Marketmore. Tablegreen 65 has vigorous vines. It is resistant to powdery mildew and produces dark green fruit.

For a steady supply of cucumbers through the season, Minges suggested an early planting of one or two hills of early maturing Marketmore or of another early variety, Challenger, which is resistant to mosaic but not to scab. A planting of Tablegreen 65, two or

three weeks later, would assure a steady supply throughout late summer.

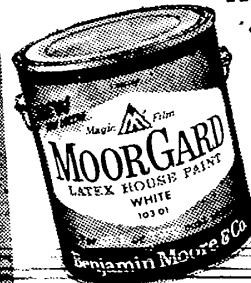
