## Dates Set For Laurel Festival At Wellsboro, Pa.

The Governor of Pennsylvania, Hon. Raymond P. Shafer, and the United States First Army Band from Washington, D. C., will lead the Grand Parade on Saturday, June 17 of the Pennsylvania State Laurel Festival to be held in Wellsboro, Pa., June 16, 17, and 18.

Sixty-four Queens, all 1967 graduates of Pennsylvania High Schools from all parts of the state, will vie for the crown of Pennsylvania State Laurel Queen at the twenty-sixth annual State Laurel Festival on Friday, Saturday and Sunday, June 16, 17, and 18 at Wellsboro, Pa. in the heart of Pennsylvania's beautiful Mountain Laurel country.

Festivities start with the welcoming of the Queens at an open-air ceremony at 10 A. M. on Friday morning. In the afternoon there will be a tour of the Country to Pennsylvania's Grand Canyon, in which all of the Queens take part. At seven in the evening the Old Guard Fife and Drum Corps, made up of selected musicians from the U. S. Army Band Unit in Washington, D. C. will give an exhibition on the stage of the Senior High School. At eight o'clock the Queen's Preview will take place on the same stage. All sixty-four Queens will be introduced at this event and entertainment will be furnished by the renowned Wellsboro Men's Chorus.

A special feature of the parade which is held at 1:30 Saturday afternoon will be the appearance of thirty new white Oldsmobiles furnished by the Oldsmobile Division of General Motors. These cars, twenty-five of them convertibles and five Toronados will provide for the dignitaries and draw the many beautiful floats upon which the Queens ride. The cars will be used later for affairs in connection with the Miss America Pageant.

Nineteen bands and marching units totaling more than a thousand and persons will march in the parade following the Governor of Pennsylvania and the First U. S. Army Band. Also in this year's parade will be a large contingent of "Antique Cars" from Eastern Clubs.

Saturday's activities will be climaxed by the Coronation of the Pennsylvania State Laurel Queen for 1967 at 8 P. M., on Wellsboro's beautiful Public Square "The Green". Many interesting and entertaining exhibits and events will take place throughout the festival which will be concluded with a Union Church Service at 11 A. M. Sunday, June 18.

## Is Your Insurance O.K. For That Trip To Expo?

New York motorists planning a drive to Expo 67 should make sure that their automobile insurance coverage meets Canadian requirements, the New York State Department of Motor Vehicles has announced.

The legal minimum coverage in New York State does not match the requirements of the Province of Quebec — site of Expo 67. The Motor Vehicle Department advises prospective Expo 67 visitors to contact their insurance agents or carriers to obtain a qualifying "yellow card."

This "yellow card" is the "Canadian Non-Resident Inter-Province Motor Vehicle Liability Card," and it should be in the owner's possession when he crosses the border. The card certifies that the owner's coverage meets auto insurance requirements in all provinces of Canada.

All insurance carriers will provide this card and coverage on request, but carriers should receive requests a reasonable time before the journey to Expo 67 begins, the Department pointed out.

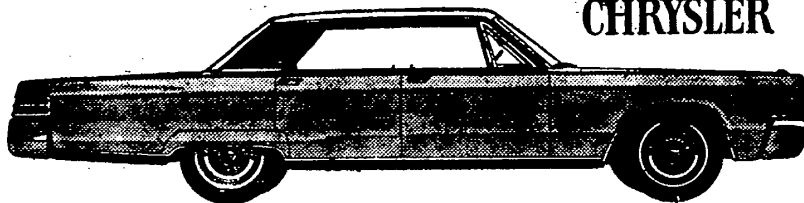

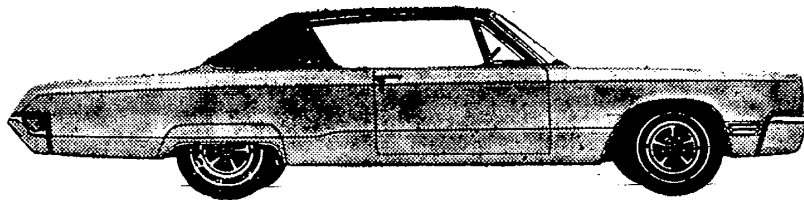

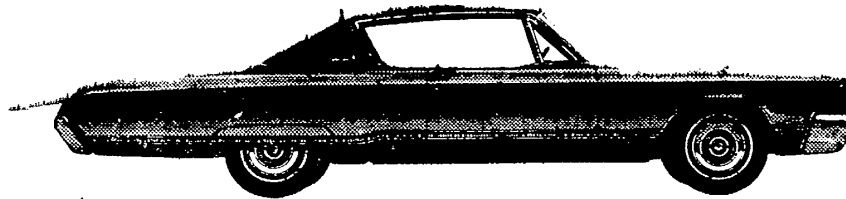
