In Washington, D. C. on June 14, 1923, 72 delegates from national patriotic organizations assembled to adopt a universal flag code. This assembly was held by the National Americanism committee of the American Legion.

The code they set up was generally followed although it wasn't federally authorized. On June 22, 1942 when World War II came, Congress acted and the President signed the joint resolution known as Public Law 623. This law provides in the first part for the codification of existing rules and customs for civilian guidance apart from regulations for official government branches. It also states that the flag should be displayed on all days when the weather permits, especially on National and State holidays. It should be displayed at public administration buildings and schools daily; and in or near polling places during elections.

There are almost 100 special days when our flag must be flown. Let's make June 14 a real show for "Old Glory" in Andover.
