Andover Summer School Reading Program

There will be a Summer Reading Program, under the direction of Mr. Glenn Bronson, at the School July 3 through July 31, with no classes on July 4.

The reading program will consist of two regular classroom instruction classes, at reading levels 3 - 4 and 5 - 6. The class size will not exceed 15 to 20 students.
